Biographical history: Drummond, Antony John Deane-, b 1917. Educated at Marlborough College and Royal Military Academy, Woolwich; commissioned in 1937 in the Royal Signals; war service in Europe and North Africa, Prisoner of War, Italy, 1941 (escaped 1942); Lieutenant 1940; acting Captain 1942, acting Major, 1943, Capt 1945; Staff College, 1945; acting Lt Col 1945; Brigade Major, 3rd Parachute Regiment, 1946-1947; Instructor, RMA Sandhurst, 1949-1951; Major 1950, Instructor, Staff College, 1952-1955; Lt Col 1956; Commanding Officer, 22 Special Air Service (SAS) Regiment, 1957-1960; Col 1961; acting Brig 1961; Brigade Commander 44 Parachute Brigade, 1961-1963; Asst Commandant, RMA Sandhurst, 1963-1966; Brig 1964; Major General 1966; GOC 3rd Div, 1966-1968; Asst Chief of the Defence Staff (Operations), 1968-1970; retired 1971. Died 4 Dec 2012.

Scope and content: Chapter entitled '22 Special Air Service Operations in Muscat & Oman 1958/59' with accompanying photographs and sketches, also including a photocopy of an account of the military operation in Oman in *The Times* April 9 1959. The chapter was originally written for the *The Imperial War Museum Book of Modern Warfare* (Macmillians, 2002). The published version was however severely reduced.
